

What is the Prevent Duty?



Section 26 of the Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015 places a duty on certain bodies to have "due regard to the need to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism".

We must:

- Assess the risk of learners being drawn into terrorism
- Protect children and young people from being drawn into terrorism by having robust safeguarding policies
- Ensure safeguarding arrangements take into account the policies and procedures of the Local Safeguarding Children Board
- Expected to ensure children are safe from terrorist and **extremist** material when accessing the internet.

The Prevent Strategy aims to:

- Respond to the ideological challenge of terrorism and the threat we face from those who promote it
- Prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support
- Work with sectors and institutions where there are risks of **radicalisation** which we need to address.

Radicalisation and Extremism

Radicalisation

Vocal or active opposition to fundamental British Values. This includes calls for the death of members of the British Armed Forces.

Extremism

The promotion or advancement of an ideology based on violence, hatred, or intolerance, that aims to negate or destroy the fundamental rights and freedoms of others, undermine, overturn, or replace the UK's system of liberal parliamentary democracy and democratic rights, or intentionally create a permissive environment for others to achieve results intended.
